Everything got done. Sails, boat covers and turtle busters are at Ming's. Taffy took several lengths of rope for repair. The centerboards are okay but there are two Dennis wants to take a closer look at before signing off as OK. And the whole event only took a little over 2 hours!

• Shed maintenance October 22

Per Chris Hatch: on October 22nd, Peter vG, Dennis, Herb, David, and Chris removed the old/rotted panels on the back of the boat shed, repaired the support boards underneath, and attached new panels. Herb and Dennis also replaced and primer painted the wooden frame surrounding the vent in the front right corner of the shed. After construction, Peter and Chris painted the back of the shed with several coats of primer paint. After the successful (rescheduled) Fun Sail on October 30th, Chris caulked the seams and corners. After helping take the boats out of the water on November 5th, Peter vG and Chris painted the back with one coat of blue topcoat paint, and Chris went back and painted the back of the shed again, as well as painting most of the rest of the shed again with the same blue paint. David is very pleased with the result and is going to send me a check to reimburse me for what I spent on paint and caulking. He will also reimburse Dennis for what he spent for the lumber and screws used.

He was swimming between boats at the Honga River anchorage and realized, with the wind and current, that he was struggling and returned to his boat. Milt also stated that he realized the current was pulling him away from the boat and returned sooner than he had planned. Lesson

– vests can save you at a time you don't even realize you are in danger; don't be blasé about using them.

Antonio volunteered to do the Racing Clinic this spring – need to double check with Peter P to make sure this works for him, whether he wants to lead, be involved, or hand over the tiller.

Milt and Peter discussed briefly their roles as "nominating committee", process still to be finalized.
